PRESENTATION TO THE BEAUFORT CITY COUNCIL

A PILOT RECYCLING PROGRAM

FOR THE HENRY C CHAMBERS PARK

Good Evening,

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to address the City Council. The Environment Issues Team of Indivisible Beaufort worked in conjunction with SCCCL, Friends of Hunting Island, DNR, Audubon, Sea Island Corridor Coalition and many concerned citizens to educate our residents and visitors about the dangers of single use plastic bags to our coastal ecosystem as well as inland waterways and storm water management programs. We are a 501-C4 nonprofit "defending our earth, our rights, and our neighbors through actions informed by our core principles of truth, justice and inclusion."

We appreciate your effort and support for the recently passed single-use plastic bag ban—an important but first step—toward protecting our environment from unnecessary contamination. While all agree that this is not a total solution to the seemingly, ever-growing litter and plastic pollution problem, it is hoped that the enactment and enforcement will provide teachable moments for our residents and visitors about the importance of protecting our environment and encourage further efforts by our residents.

As a second step, Indivisible Beaufort proposes that a recycling program be established at the crowning gem of the City of Beaufort – our beloved Henry C Chambers Park- the pride and joy of residents and visitors alike. This is only the beginning. We will be coming back before you to request expansion of the program throughout the city as success can be demonstrated.

For this purpose, we have met with Linda Roper who also is interested in getting recycling going in the City. In her budget request she has already included a request to purchase additional trash cans in the park. Some of these funds could be used for this pilot project for five attractive recycling containers to be distributed at critical areas throughout the Park.

This pilot program would emphasize the critical importance of recycling in our long-term efforts to protect our environment by recycling cans, bottles and plastics. We are willing to coordinate efforts with The Greenery who currently handles park and street trash collection in the main downtown corridor, Lamar Taylor with Beaufort City Public Works, Tyrone Brice at Waste Pro, and Fire Chief Reese Bertholf to make sure cans go to the Children's Burn Unit all year long and not just during festivals.

Public education is a critical piece to successful recycling. We are researching best practice for public park recycling with Keep America Beautiful and Beaufort County Recycling Coordinator Ashley Jenkins who has provided information on the successful program implemented in our capital city Columbia.

This new effort will become an important signal that the City encourages an ethic of environmental protection through recycling and responsible use of our City, the surrounding sea islands, and our precious and economically important maritime environment which is so vital to our area.

We urge you to seriously consider this modest investment in our community's continuing and significant effort to protect our environment from potential degradation. Action is required.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

There are several openings on the City's planning-related boards. Staff has queried applicants who have applied for previous board positions and there are a number of candidates interested in the positions. Interviews with City Council have been set up for the July 10 Council workshop. The open positions are as follows:

- Metropolitan Planning Commission (MPC). There is one open position. There are two candidates for this position.
- Design Review Board (DRB). There are two open positions for this board. One position is for a citizen representative. There are two candidates for this position. The other open position is for a design professional. There is one candidate for this position.
- Historic District Review Board (HRB). There is one open position. The position is for a person who either lives or owns property in the Historic District. Typically this seat has been held by someone who either lives or owns property in the Northwest Quadrant. There are five candidates for this position.
- Park & Tree Advisory Commission (PTAC). There are two open positions. One of the positions is for a design professional. There are four candidates for this position. There is also an open position for a certified arborist. There are no candidates for this position.
